## President of the Young Women's Christian Association, Hongkong.

Mrs. P. S. F. Ts'o, whose maiden name is Amy Holi is a native of Lingping, Kwangtang, born at Canton, in 1998. When she as 13 years of age, her father died, leaving six children behind with but little means. Being the eddes child in the family, she beded to find money not only for her own education but also for her brother and sisters. She managed however to study at True ight School, Canton, which is the oldest educational institute for girls in South China, having been established 60 years ago, for graduation from the school with unusual honour of heing the first in every class, she took up the normal course and finished accurse in 1916. Saving some money from her salary as a teacher at her school for two years, she again joined Trie Light Middle school, Pake Hok Tung, and was again engaged as a teacher of the school for two years after her graduation there in 1920. She steral Lingman University, Canton, in 1922 and graduated with the Bachelor degree of Arts and with the educational Diploma (1925). At the request of True Light Middle School, she joined the teaching stall and remained in the post until she married ov P. S. F. Ts'o, view of St. Paul's Church, Hongkong, in 1923.

She in an oarnest Christian, and her life motto is, "Not to be ministered unto but to minister". That is why in her school us, she organized a Service League for the villages. She went very regularly with a number of girls into the villages near Pak ok Tung and Linguan, toaching and preaching. She taught the villagers, particularly the women and children, about hygine, bout book and, above all, about God. Consequently, she was a well known figure among the village people.

In 1926, she was sent to Shanghai for the National Christian Education Conference as a delegate, representing Kwangtung ro vince.

Since her marriage, she has lived in Houghong. She was engaged as a tencher in St. Paul's titris' College for three years.

In 1930 she was in vited to attend the National Young Women's Christian Association Conference at Shanghai.

When the Council of True Light Middle School Canton decided to open a branch school in the Colony in 1935, she was peatedly asked to be the Principal of the new school. It is said that as she is known as a born teacher and is righly equipped ith knowledge of Child Psychology, Story-telling, methods of teaching, School Administration, and with ten years' experience i teaching, it is a great pity that she does not take up education as her life work. Finally, she accepted the post.

As to her social activities, she is the President of the Young Women's Christian Association, Hongkong, Vice-president of nti-Muitsai Society, and the Secretary of the Dioceson Women's Auxiliary, these three posts she has held ever since 1934. She also the President of the Women's Auxiliary, St. Paul's Church.
