

Mr. Tsang is a native of Po On District, Kwangtung Province, where he was born in 1888. His father was a prominent Chinese merchant of long residence in Indo-China, and Mr. Tsang was brought there to receive his early education in his minor age. Later, he returned to China and then came to Hongkong, when he was but fourteen years of age.

He began his career with a low position in his uncle's shop. By his exerting struggles and unwearying intellegence he was promoted gradually, and finally, upon the death of his uncle in 1914, he was promoted as general manager of the shop, which at present stands distinctively amongst its line of business under the name of Ah Yung, Shipping and painters.

Besides this, Mr. Tsang is also partner or stockholder of many other firms.

Mr. Tsang is usually highly populated for his kindness and generosity. As long as charity concerns, Mr. Tsang is quite sure to help with his best part.

He is a member of the Committee of the Chinese Chamber of Commerce, Hongkong. In 1932, he was appointed Chairman of the Tung Wah Hospital and in 1933, he was appointed a visiting Justice to the Po Leung Kuk. At present, Mr. Tsang is also vice-president of the Hongkong Confucian Society.

Married in 1914, Mr. Tsang has seven children. They are receiving their education at local schools.
