

Mr. K. H. LI, B.A.

Mr. Li is a native of Nan - hai District, Kwangting Province, and was born in 1892.

He received his early education from a private school of his native village, and later entered St. Stephen's College, Hongkong, where in 1912 he passed the Oxford Senior Local Examination with distinction in Chinese and the first Hongkong University Matriculation Examination. Thereupon he took an Aris course at the local University and graduated in 1916 with a B. A. degree.

In 1917 when General Ju Hing Lan was Civil Governor of Kwangtung, the Bureau of Provincial Protection was established and Mr. Li was appointed a councilor of this institution.

Mr. Li returned to Hongkong in the following year on being effered a teaching post by St. Stephen's College, his alma mater. He held this post until 1922 when he was appointed Headmaster of the Nan - hai Middle School and the Nan - hai Normal School, Canton, on the recommendation of the gentry and the Chamber of Commerce of his native district.

Appointed Inspector of vernacular Schools and English Private Schools by the Education Department in 1924, he returned to the Colony for a second time. In two years he was transferred to the Headmastership of the Government Vernacular Middle School, and that of the Government Normal School, the former institution was founded in 1926 and the latter in 1921.

Mr. Li is a man of bread spurpathy and every good cause flads him a willing supporter. In recognition of his success in educational work he was elected a number of the Advisory Committee of the Kwangtung Provincial Education Association in 1924 before he came back to Hongkong is that year. The various social services he has rendered in Canton and Hongkong may be well signified by the following elections and appointments. He has served as member of the school council of the Yan-hai Mibble School, Shak Moon Middle School, Canton, Executivee Committee of the Confucius Hall; Hon, member of the Chinese Association of the Hongkong University, and Hon. Treasurer of the Hongkong University Graduates' Association, Hongkong.

In 1928 he was called upon together with Dr. Au Tai Tin and Dr. Lai Chai Hsi to draft the scheme and syllabus for the establishment of the Chinese Schoool of the beel University, and has served as member of its Board of Examination.

Mr. Li is an adopt of Chinese Huratura and plutarity art, He is a member of the U-Shia Literary Association at Changellsu, Klangsu Province; member of the Nan-Shia Literary Association at Changella, Hunan Province, and member of the China National Laurning Association at Wu Hsien, Klangsu Province the last two being the leading societies of men of letters in China. But has published three of his many literary works in Chinese, namely, the Pi Yun Lau Poems, a study of Soven-Word-Line Poems, and a set of three books entitled Model Readers on the Dictions and Styles of Chinese Essayists. For the last work he is a joint clitor. Being a conneissour of Chinese painting he was responsible for the organization of the Chinese Pictorial art Section of the Chinese Pi
